
## Art at Home!





## **Art At Home! Middle & Upper Primary**

Optical Art, better known as Op Art, is an abstract style of art that creates an optical illusion (where your eyes trick your brain!). The art movement became popular in the 1960's by Bridget Riley and Victor Vasarely. They used patterns and colours to disorient (confuse) the viewer. Another famous Op Artist is Escher.
