Council Decisions and Updates

Council Meeting September 11th 2023

- Student leaders Decision made to invite the student leaders to the October School council Meeting. This occurs once a year, and is an opportunity for the student leaders to provide feedback on the work they have done, and understand more about how the Council works.
- Decision to change structure of some Sub committees. OSHC will move to the Education committee and we now have the old Fundraising and Initiatives committee split into
 - Bentleigh Farmers Market and Grants (Convener Rachel Jeffreys)
 - Fundraising and Events (Convener Leah Moore)
- Decision to hold a Sausage sizzle at the Referendum with proceeds to be donated to the State Schools Relief Organisation

Council Meeting October 9th 2023

- The School Review results report was presented by DET representative Stuart Andrews. A summary of the results will be published on the School Website shortly.
- DE requires schools to conduct 3 surveys throughout each school year namely:
 - o Attitudes to School Survey (ATOSS)- students Year 4-6- 151 respondents
 - o Parent Opinion Survey-(POS)-265 surveys sent, 26 responses- 10%
 - School Staff Survey (SSS)

We are particularly proud of the ATTOS survey results which tell us that our students are happy and engaged at our school. An overview of the results is attached at the end of the newsletter.

Committee Updates

September:

- We undertook a short, one-question survey of those coming through the gates at the August market "Have you attended Bentleigh Farmers' Market before?"
- We were pleased to see that around 25% of people were attending the market for the first time. We also had a long-standing stallholder ask whether we'd moved our signs because he'd noticed lots of new people visiting his stall. Good to see our social media advertising is paying off.
- We had our first sell out month at the Breakfast Stall in August, with 150 rolls sold by around 11.30am. We'll therefore increase our ordering by 25 rolls for September.

Communication and Engagement Committee

The Communications and Engagement Committee is responsible for communications in two areas:

September

- Padding for both the AFL and basketball goal posts has arrived and attached.
- Tasks yet to be allocated for work, but in the priority list are:

- o re-mulching of the triangular and firepit gardens on the southern side of the school as well as the sensory garden between block A and the PAC
- o clearing the staff carpark of built-up leaf litter
- o renewing softfall in the built playground areas
- o adding sand to the jumping /sandpit area

October

- Our arborist Daryl from 3 Way Tree Services completed the required work to the termite ridden trees, our welcome tree and pruned trees and shrubs to clear pathways.
- Carmello our gardening maintenance man also completed the monthly mow of the oval and other areas throughout the school.
- Manuel completed some regular maintenance tasks around the school; namely clearing drains and clearing the debris from the staff carpark.
- SC discussed the status of the oval. School will look to aerate the grass to give some improvements for a short term fix. School will look to potentially water the ground again.
