# Risk Management - Evacuation Drill

As part of our ongoing safety and risk management procedures at school, we will be holding an 'evacuation drill' (practice) at school on Monday morning. These drills are required to be practiced once every term and take the following forms. Firstly we will practice an onsite evacuation drill, which means students and staff making their way onto the oval as calmly and quickly as possible. Later in the year we will practice this again, as well as an off site evacuation drill where we will move our students to Moorleigh Village. The next drill will be a lockdown drill where students and staff are required to stay in classrooms with no movement around the school. As it is the first drill for the year, we have advised teachers to ensure their classes are prepared for what they will see and hear during this drill.



### Reminder: Easter Bonnet Parade - Thursday 6th April

As we near the end of Term 1 with Easter being during the holidays we will have an Easter Bonnet Parade on Thursday 6th April. We ask that you get your creative juices flowing to support your child to make a special Easter bonnet to show off at our whole school parade on the Basketball Court at 9am on the last day of school.

Reminder: Dogs on school grounds Whilst I count myself as a dog lover, having 3 grandfur babies of my own, I need to remind you once again that that we ask that dogs not be brought into the school environment for a couple of reasons. Firstly, we have some children who are terrified of dogs and secondly sometimes they can leave unwanted 'deposits' in our yard. I regularly have to speak to non-school families after school about cleaning up after their dogs especially around the playground/oval areas where our children play.
