Hello everyone,

Even though remote learning is now in its fourth week, in many ways it feels like longer. As we settle more into our newly developing routines, I'd like to remind everyone again that the remote learning day is not the same as an on-site school day. The tasks set by your child's teachers vary according to the year level and follow DET recommendations for the amount of time students spend on the core areas, as well as other areas such as Art, French, PE, Kitchen and Instrumental Music. We certainly do not expect children to be sitting at a desk or table from 9.00 till 3.30pm. (They don't even do that on a 'normal' school day). We also understand that some days are easier than others for all sorts of reasons, so please remember what I said last week - the most important thing is your and your child's mental health.

At our staff meeting this week I asked class teachers to include Sue and I into their class meetings and what a delight it has been this week catching up with your children and being able to chat to them 'face to face'. These meetings have definitely been the highlight of my week and reminded me strongly of the reason we are all here - to support children to learn and grow.

Our Specialist teachers are also providing tasks/activities, as well as interacting with the children and teachers during class meetings. I wonder how many students are completing the Star Wars exercise challenge this month - I know one family for sure is ©

Teachers will be available for class related work with your children from 9am - 3.30pm.

As per any other school day, teachers also have planning time, meeting times, lunch, breaks and other duties (such as leadership duties etc) that are still happening behind the scenes. From an administrative perspective, all teachers have multiple roles they are fulfilling, including like yourselves being parents of children who are remote learning themselves, carers for elderly, dealing with illness and dealing with many of the same issues that you will be at home. They have been putting in long hours to support our students in remote learning. A big thank you to our families for their support, patience, positive responses and feedback. I know that our teachers really appreciate it.

We are all learning new skills, but most importantly, we need to be taking care of our health and wellbeing. I have advised staff to balance their work time carefully, so please do not expect any responses outside of regular hours. Should you have concerns, Sue and I are available to talk with you during normal office hours every day, even though we are also alternating working both on and off site during the week, with both of us on site on Mondays, then Sue on Tuesdays and Thursdays and me on Wednesdays and Fridays. We can also be contacted by email on any day.

You will find attached to this bulletin a snapshot of some of the activities our students have completed during their learning at home time. I was so touched and proud of the 'random acts of kindness' that Molly Jane in 6A completed.

Finally we are all waiting with some anticipation for next Monday when the current state of emergency ends. Rest assured we will communicate with you as things develop.


