# Staff Carpark

A reminder to all families that the staff carpark is strictly for staff only, with the only exception being parents with 'disabled' stickers who have made prior arrangements with us. Over the last few weeks we have noticed the following potentially dangerous behaviours beginning to creep in:

- \* Parents driving into the carpark to drop their children off.
- \* Driving into the carpark to do a U-turn.
- \* Parking in the carpark (thus taking the spot of a staff member) and walking their child through the carpark to class.
- \* Parents walking through the carpark, instead of using the front gates to enter the school.
- \* Parents walking their children through the carpark to attend breakfast club.
- \* Unsupervised younger children allowed to play in the carpark at the end of the day.

Just last week, as I left the school after 5:00pm I was involved in a near miss when an unsupervised child ran into the carpark whilst adults were standing chatting near the gate. At that time of the afternoon there were few cars in the carpark but as the sun was setting visibility was compromised, so it was only by chance that I spotted some movement that made me stop - it was a split-second reaction that avoided the child being hit. It was a frightening moment for all involved.

Parents, please do not engage in the above behaviours as they are dangerous. Also please be vigilant when you and your children are anywhere where cars and humans interact. It only takes a split second to lose sight of a young child and the consequences could be catastrophic. I thank all those parents who are acting in a safe manner, by parking either at Moorleigh or neighbouring streets and walking their children into school.

It seems that I need to remind everyone again that dogs not be brought onsite at drop off and pick up time. We have a number of students who have high anxiety around dogs so no matter how lovely and well socialized your furry four legged friend is please do not bring them onsite to wander amongst the children. Thank you.
